Responses may include teacher modeling, shared writing, collaborative group work, and independent responses. Students in grades K-5 will use rubrics to analyze work samples and identify areas of strengths and needs. Teachers will conduct writing conferences with students in order to review, revise, and edit writing. STEM teachers in grades K-5 will model and assign informational writing tasks that align with the science curriculum. STEM teachers will work with ELA teachers and the reading specialists in order to design writing lessons and align student expectations with county rubrics.	1x per week 1x per quarter Weekly	Students in grades 3-5 will score 80% on informational, narrative and opinion writing pieces as measured by the CCPS Writing Rubrics.
