Advanced Academics/Gifted and Talented

Direct instruction on the Primary Thinking Skills (visual, deductive, analytical, divergent):
Pre-K to grade 2- Four (4) times a year

May work with small groups of students as needed to provide extensions/advancement to grade level content, as appropriate.

Administer CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) to all Grade 2 students in January/February. This test is used to identify students who have the potential for gifted thinking ability.

- If you want to volunteer, please do your volunteer training as soon as possible. It takes some time to get entered in the system.



Important Information

Please check your child's folder and agenda daily. This is how we will communicate homework, schedule, and school issues.



Please write notes about schedule changes on a separate sheet of paper or email your child's teacher. These are sent to the office. Please do not write them in the agenda.

•County policy prohibits food being served in the classroom. This means we cannot give the kids birthday or holiday treats. Students may pass out non-food items like pencils, erasers, stickers, etc.

•Students will have time for snack in the afternoon. Please make sure to send in an easy, healthy, peanut/nut free snack that is not messy. If your child forgets snack, we tell them they can pick something from lunch to save and have during snack time.

•On days when your child has PE, please make sure they are wearing appropriate clothing.

Supplies

- Mid year and if supplies are low, you may receive a note that your child needs a supply refresh. We will also let you know if we need extra.
- Your student's agenda is supplied by the PTA. If it is lost, it can be replaced for a small fee, if supplies are still available.
- Your child was given an SOS folder (white "puppy" folder) on the first day of school. These will be replaced in January. They are paper, so is helpful to tape or use clear contact paper to protect the folder from tearing or splitting.
